Minutes of CVCA Board Meeting Feb. 13, 2017

Previous Board Meeting (Nov. 18, 2016)

Minutes were approved by unanimous vote.

New Board Member

Charlie Wahle was approved to fill the newly vacant seat of Secretary.

Board Member Duties

Member roles and tasks were reviewed and assigned.

Fire Abatement

- Reviewed recent history of grants received and pending.
- Board agreed to move forward quickly with planning and contracting on current grant from Cypress Fire before its June 2017 expiration.

Infrastructure

Architectural Review

- Reviewed proposal to eliminate architectural review as discussed at the annual Association meeting in Jan. 2017.
- Board's attorney is exploring options to clarify and streamline the process and is currently drafting options for Board consideration.
- Board will then craft a proposal for ratification by the full CVCA membership in late Feb. early March.

Guard Rails

- Discussed County's plans and some resident's input on various planned and proposed projects.
- Monterey County will soon seek public input for a 30-day review period before prioritizing next steps in Carmel Views.
- Board recognized the authority and constraints on the County and Cal Trans in regard to design and construction of guardrails, but also agreed to proactively work to create a more formal role and routine process for informing their project priorities, including siting decisions.

Fire Road

- Road is currently blocked by downed trees and a flooded pit, making egress and ingress impossible during a fire or other emergency.
- Although the County appears to own the road, Cypress Fire agreed to remove the downed trees.
- Monterey County is reviewing its responsibilities and may undertake repairs to the road itself.

CC&R Violations

- *Parking* -- Reviewed current instances of RVs, trailers, etc. parked in plain view. Board has contacted one resident and has agreed to meet with him at a future meeting to discuss requirements and options.
- Dumping Illegal disposal of trash and debris continues to be an issue. Board agreed to hire a contractor to remove existing debris in canyons and agreed to consider ways to deter future incidents (e.g. signage).
- *Viewshed* -- Issues continue to emerge in several properties. CVCA By-laws provide for Board to mediate between homeowners; Board actions to follow.
- Encroachment in Common Areas Reviewed the history of homeowners constructing in or otherwise affecting Common Areas beyond their property lines. Board agreed to consider potential ways to educate all residents about the CC&R's provisions for stewardship of CVCA's Common Areas.

Secretary

- Board reviewed the duties and responsibilities of the position and discussed next steps.
- Board agreed that Secretary may proactively reach out to Title Companies and Real Estate Agencies to provide the routine information they regularly request about properties in the CVCA.

Community Engagement

• Board discussed options for the annual party.

Website

Reviewed the history of the website and discussed options for maintaining it.
